

Post Operative Orders/Instructions

- 1. Take pain medication as prescribed. Unless otherwise informed, most patients can take ibuprofen (Advil or Motrin) 400mg every six hours *in addition to* their prescription narcotic medication.
- 2. Patients at home who cannot urinate after 6 hours of trying should call our office immediately.
- 3. Patients whose incisions are closed with skin glue <u>may shower</u> the day after surgery.
- 4. Incisions closed with skin glue should not be treated with ointments, creams or lotions, as they may dissolve the glue and allow your incision to open.
- 5. Patients with inhalational anesthesia should not drive a vehicle for 48 hours after surgery.
- 6. All patients must have a ride home after surgery. Taxi cabs are not an acceptable form of transportation home.
- 7. Most patients may resume light duty work or exercise after surgery, assuming their pain is controlled. Narcotic pain medication is not recommended in the workplace or at the gym.
- 8. Unless otherwise specified, sexual activity may be resumed after surgery at the patient's discretion.
- 9. Bruising, swelling and pain are expected after surgery. Use ice packs as instructed and take all prescription medications precisely as written on the label.
- 10. Redness, fever, or unexpected drainage at your incision is rare and should be reported to our office.
- 11. Constipation after surgery is very common. Most patients find relief with Milk of Magnesia, two ounces followed by 16 ounces of water.
- 12. Nausea, vomiting or food intolerance that persists for more than two days after surgery should be reported immediately to our office.
- 13. Climbing stairs after surgery is usually okay assuming the patient will have some assistance for the first one or two days, or as needed.
